Find the card **Sad** / **Triste** in English and **French** (**Français**), then find the matching card with the words **Hope** / **Éspoir** to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.







Find the card **Jealousy** / **Celoso** in English and **Spanish** (**Español**), then find the matching card with the words **Curiosity** / **Curiosidad** to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.







Find the card **Silly** in English and **Sign Language**, then find the matching card with the word **Self-Control** to practice how to sign the words and discuss their meaning.







Find the card **Anger** / **huhu** in English and **Hawaiian**, then find the matching card with the words **Patience** / **hoomanawanui** to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.







Find the card **Confusion** / 착란(chang-lan) in English and **Korean**, then find the matching card with the words Understanding / 이터 (ee-hay) to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.







Find the card **Nervous** / স্নায়বকি (sneye-bika) in English and Bangla (Bengali), then find the matching card with the words **Excited** / উত্তজেতি (oo-tter-jitta) to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.

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Find the card **Distracted** مشتت الذهن (mush-a-tat ad-nihn) in English and **Arabic**, then find the matching card with the words **Connected** متصل (mu-ta-sil) to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.







Try translanguaging! This is using all the languages you know to make a poem about food. Try guessing the meaning of the different words used in the poem Mia Mezzeh!: café sans lait (French) / salsa verde (Spanish) / smorgasbord (Swedish) / mille feuille (French) / mia mezzeh (Arabic) / un banquet (French). What new words did you learn in English and other languages? How could this strategy help you learn new languages?







Find the card **Gloomy** / අදුරැ (aň-du-ru) in English and Sinhala, then find the matching card with the words **Forgiveness** / සමාව (sam-ā-va) to practice speaking the words and discussing their meaning.




